Leila Heller Gallery is pleased to present the solo exhibition by Azza Al Qubaisi's (b. 1978), who is most often referred to as the UAE's first Emirati jewellery designer. It is more accurate to describe Azza Al Qubaisi as an artist, designer and entrepreneur. All her works reveal her prolific creativity, with jewellery and sculptures made from gold, silver, wood, rubber tyres, palm trees and oudh incense.

As a fierce advocate of all that is home grown and sustainable, Al Qubaisi has been dedicated to a sustainable future for her country. She is seen to use simple materials that were an essential part of Emirati families' lives in the pre-oil period. The natural landscape and cultural references coalesce in her pieces, from the shapes, patterns and textures of the desert to the revival of traditional ancient techniques which can all be easily observed in her works.

The works of Al Qubaisi are a reflection of her journey as an artist as she explores her Emirati heritage.

Al Qubaisi is an artist who knows no compromise when it comes to exploring, sharing and cultivating her vision for the past, present and future. At the same time, she endeavours to engage, support and empower younger artists, bringing them into her own artistic sphere of influence. "When I started sharing my art and allowing people to come into my life, everything changed. Instead of doing everything alone, I realized I can make a lot of people happy by allowing them to be part of my life, and that has made me a much happier person."


"He who has no past has no present or future" the quote of late Sheikh Zayed has been a big part of my journey, discovery of myself and sharing my passion.


Through the simple materials that where an essential part in our families life pre-oil period, I use the same materials such as the palm branches and weaving and Sadu in methods I developed during the past decade integrating them in my work in a contemporary way.

Curvy palm branch walls in different heights are the main structure of this installation creating a smooth space where the visitors can walk through and experience the installation ...

A journey to discover and see the different materials which were important in the daily life like weaved Saaf made from palm leaves, Sadu made from wool, tali threads with metals such as gold and silver inlayed displayed in an integrated way within the installation. "



"Pattern" invites us to discuss the use of geometry in connection to floral desin. We can socialize and connect while observing the artwork, which is visually divided into three parts. Six illuminated pieces of various heights, in golden colour, remind us of multi-story buildings. Each line is symbolizing a new floor.

In front of them, twelve blue shapes, dressed in velvet fabric, are shaped in a floral pattern. The third part of this intriguing artwork blends the two and represents a comfortable seating area. All parts together combine a pattern of three floral compositions, connecting the cold industrial feel with inviting hospitality of the seating area.

The color palette that the artist used for this artwork contains various shades of blue and gold, consistent with the use of Islamic patterns throughout history. The beams of light make this work very visually-appealing.
















Falcons (Between The Lines), 2018 70 x 75 x 60 cm Mild steel
























Methaphor 4, 2021 44 x 22 x 42 cm Mild steel and Stainless steel


