Paris was well overdue for a festival of Iranian arts. Iranian Arts Now,

which runs until 24 July at the the Cité Internationale des Arts, is a welcome programme of visual and video arts, film, performance, dance and music. Half a dozen curators have brought together approximately 50 artists in different disciplines, making this a veritable collaboration of scale. The project was the brainchild of American University Professor Margery Arent Safir of Arts Arena fame, whose enthusiasm enabled this project to happen at short notice and on a small budget.




Image: Shoja Azari, Untitled (still), 2012, Video projection on blank canvas, Dimensions variable




Image: Bahar Sabzevari, Untitled, 2012, Acrylic on canvas, 64 x 81 in (163 x 206 cm)




Image: Artist Iké Udé featured in the 73rd International Best-Dressed List of Vanity Fair
