Today he directs the Re Rebaudengo Foundation and Pitti Immagine Discovery.

Luca Beatrice, a critic and

curator among the most famous of the Italian scene as well as a lecturer, journalist and writer, has curated the Italian Pavilion of the 2009 Venice Biennale.
