<u>Jaume Plensa</u>, *Triptych*, 2009, at <u>Mario Mauroner</u> <u>Contemporary</u>

<u>Stephan Balkenhol</u>, Woman with black dress and blue coat, 2014, at <u>Deweer Gallery</u>

<u>Jan Farbe</u>, Skull with Magpie, 2001, at <u>Mario Mauroner</u> Contemporary Art Working with natural tropical beetles, the artist takes the viewer into another dimension where we are impressed with how the body, the blood, and the death is preserved in such an artwork.
