
Beyond Fate

Their bodies move together, at times peacefully and harmoniously and at other times with anger, aggression and determination. Theirs is a tug-a-war dance between power and fate. The mythical creatures found in the works of Iranian New York-based artist Soraya Sharghi's latest body of works prance nude around her vibrant impressively detailed canvases, drenched in a multitude of colors and forms, which harken back to the artist's Persian heritage and the exquisite detailing found in Qajar-era paintings. Her figures fight passionately as if against fate, exploring the role of power in society and what happens when power is lost and then regained.

The female Biblical figure of Eve has long played a pivotal role in the artist's work and can be found once again in her latest paintings. Unashamed of her femininity and uninhibited in their immense size and surrounding kaleidoscope of colors, the female figures in Sharghi's works are proud, strong and bold. The artist is interested not only in mythology but in creating new mythologies, new stories that reflect our present day. Eve, in the creation myth of Adam and Eve, commits the sin after she is lured by a serpent to eat the fruit from the forbidden tree. Sharghi prefers to view the myth in another light. "Eve was brave enough to try new things-she took a risk," she says. Through her explosive cataclysmic renderings on canvas, Sharghi portrays Eve in a new manner-she is now a figure of power. Her strength lies in her own authenticity and female might. Her movements across the canvas guestion what happens when power is lost and then regained. Persian symbolism, in the form of carpets and even hairstyles that can be traced back to Qajar paintings, solidify the importance of Sharghi's heritage appropriating remnants from its visual history to reflect on themes pertinent to the present day. The figures, as they dance around each other, their bodies in constant dialogue and friction against Sharghi's illuminated background, appear to offer a new Wway forward: the artist's latest show Beyond the Realm is a gateway into another world, time and space. It is a way for us to retreat from reality as exists in everyday life and enter into a new and imaginative and fantasy realm, where time and space don't exist and where her subjects play out some of the most challenging subjects that man has confronted and continues to confront across time. In many ways the works of Sharghi channel what Carl Jung once called "the collective unconscious"-the deepest recesses of the unconscious mind that is genetically inherited and not shaped by personal experience. In Sharghi's works art becomes a shared medium across multiple cultures and hisWorical divides. The paintings, done in acrylic on canvas often with flecks of expressive and regal gold leaf, lead us to question our reality versus our fantasy realm and how, as Sharghi suggests, it is perhaps in the imaginative realm of our unconscious mind that we work out mankind's deepest and most unsettling problems.




The Resolution of a Eve (Eve.15)




Subdued Nature (Eve.5)


