
Stories in Thousand Pieces written by Parinaz Eleish Gharagozlou

A mosaic of a thousand moments, scattered and torn, like colored shards of glass put back into a whole. Fragments of laughter and pain, the color of rain and the smell of sunsets, lives lived that speak memory and dream the future. To tell the story of a life, you search for footprints and traces of what you cannot see at a glance.

As an artist and a storyteller, I like to focus on details within a greater context. My canvases are large: what you see at a glance would be a structure, a space, or a fruit tree garden. As you get closer, you notice more and more details made of hundreds of tiny pieces. Close up, my painting communicates a different story than the one you saw from afar. It tells of the intricacies of our daily existence, the evidence of our past in our present.

Using mixed media allows me to build reality out of the many pieces. The paintings discuss politics with the viewer. I use newspapers in my work because they witness our journey through time. They guide and even mislead us. The use of newspapers in my work can be random or intentional. I do not frame my paintings. The stories continue beyond the border of the canvas.

As an observer of details of everyday life, I take hundreds of actual and mental photos wherever I am. These inform the work I do. I see commonality in human existence and our shared everyday lives.




Our Hallowed House, 2024







You Can't Hit A Moving Target, 2024 Mixed Media and Collage on Canvas 95h x 72w in. / 241.3h x 182.88w cm.




Life is but a Weaving, 2024 Mixed Media and Collage on Canvas 53h x 36w in. / 134.62h x 91.44w cm.




Six Degrees of Separation, 2020 Mixed Media and Collage on Canvas 53h x 37w in. / 134.62h x 93.98w cm.




Like the Night Waiting for the Day, 2024 Mixed Media and Collage on Canvas 66h x 50w in. / 167.64h x 127w cm.






The Fall, 2024




The Influencers, 2023



PARINAZ ELEISH GHARAGOZLOU

BIOGRAPHY

Parinaz Eleish Gharagozlou was born in Tehran to an Iranian mother (historian/publisher) and an Egyptian father (economist.) She grew up in Tehran until high school and finished her diploma in Switzerland before coming to the US for her higher education. Eleish recieved a BFA in Film Production and Painting from Emerson College and the Museum of Fine Arts in 1981. She holds two MFAs: one in Film Production from Boston University and one in English Writing and Poetry from the University of New Hampshire.

After graduation, Eleish worked in various areas of film production at different independent Boston film production companies. For five years she held the position of Film and Media Coordinator at the French Library and Cultural Center, now merged with the Alliance Francaise in Boston. In 1993, Eleish moved to back to Tehran where she had her own painting company, Samarkand a Faux Real co., which specialized in faux finish painting. Eleish returned to the US after three years and started Damascus Dreams, a one-man hand crafted jewelry design company specializing in work with ancient beads, before she began painting full-time.

Eleish has published poetry in English and recently published a novel in Farsi which is available in print and audio on Amazon, iTunes and related book stores as well as in Iran.

Eleish and her husband Yahya Gharagozlou and live most of the time in Boston, and part time in Tehran. She has two daughters Leila and Homa. Her studio is located in Brighton, MA.
