His work echoes the timeless elegance of Persian art while infusing it with dynamic, modern energy.

Much like the ever-changing seasons in which flowers bloom, *Timeless Blossoms* reflects on how our understanding of the past continuously evolves, blossoming into new and innovative forms. Darehbaghi's pieces delicately balance the enduring spirit of classical art with the vibrant expression of contemporary creativity, fostering a dialogue between heritage and modernity.

Timeless Blossoms reimagines Persian artistry while offering a modern reflection on the timeless bond between nature, culture, and the human experience.

## ABOUT THE ARTIST

Morteza Darehbaghi is an Iranian artist known for his exploration of free, geometric, and pattern-based forms. In 2009, his *"Birth"* series marked a shift from nature-inspired works to independent forms shaped by visible and invisible forces. His art blends the structured geometry of cityscapes with traditional Persian motifs like rug patterns and tile designs, creating a balance between order and organic forms. This combination reflects his interest in the dynamic relationship between structure and spontaneity.

Darehbaghi has exhibited internationally, with solo shows at Foundry in Dubai, Iranshahr Art Gallery in Tehran, and Meem Gallery in Dubai. He has participated in major events like the 54th Venice Biennale and Abu Dhabi Art. His work has earned several awards, including first place at the Tehran Museum of Contemporary Art and the Islamic World Biennial. His pieces have also appeared in major auctions at Christie's Dubai and Bonhams.

## ABOUT THE GALLERY

Since its establishment over four decades ago in New York, Leila Heller Gallery has gained worldwide recognition as a pioneer in promoting a creative dialogue and exchange between Western artists and Middle Eastern, Central and Southeast Asian artists.
